⁷ “Let us rejoice and be glad and give the glory to Him, for the marriage of the Lamb has come and His bride has made herself ready.”

⁸ It was given to her to clothe herself in fine linen, bright *and* clean; for the fine linen is the righteous acts of the saints.

⁹ Then he said to me, “Write, ‘Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb.’”

And he said to me, “These are true words of God.”

¹⁰ Then I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, “Do not do that; I am a fellow servant of yours and your brethren who hold the testimony of Jesus; worship God. For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy.”

So What?

Discussion & Application:

1. In Rev. 19:1-6 we saw four Heavenly “**Hallelujahs**” in response to God’s judgment on end times Babylon. Why are beings in heaven so excited to see God bring judgment like this? Why is their perspective so different from that of the people on earth who were mourning? Why is it right to praise God for His judgment?
2. Describe how and why you praised the Lord this past week. If you didn’t praise Him often, why not? What attributes of God lead you to worship? What should you be praising Him for daily?
3. **Jewish marriages** in the first century included: 1) Betrothal period; 2) Groom returning; 3) Wedding Celebration. Use Scripture to discuss each of those and how it relates to the ultimate Groom Jesus and His bride, the Church.
4. What does it mean in Rev. 19:7 that the “**bride has made herself ready**”? Verse 8 says that it was “**given to her to clothe herself in fine linen, bright and clean...**” But then it says the “**fine linen is the righteous acts of the saints.**” Is that a contradiction? If not, why not?
5. What is God’s role and what is our role in getting ready for the marriage of the Lamb? How do we participate with God in this process? What are you consistently doing to get ready? What will you start doing this week on a consistent basis?
6. What is the **marriage supper of the Lamb**? When does it take place? Who is invited?
7. Why do you think John fell at the feet of an angel to worship him? Why does he do it again in Rev. 22:8? What can we learn from this? How can we make sure that we only worship God?
8. What does it mean in v. 10, “the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy”? What is the “**testimony of Jesus**”? (cf. Rev. 1:2; 6:9; 12:17; 14:12; see also Jn. 5:39; Lk. 24:25-27) In what sense is this testimony of Jesus **the spirit of prophecy**?
9. To whom will you bear testimony of Jesus and His Gospel this week?
